

## **Terms and Conditions of MyCC Scheme and Common Criteria Certification and Service Marks**

### **Purpose**

- 1 The purpose of this document is to describe on how the certification and service marks for MyCC Scheme and Common Criteria under the Recognition Arrangement (CCRA) maybe used and referred to by other parties.
- 2 This document is an extraction from the Annex B under the MyCC Scheme Requirement (MyCC\_REQ), Guidance for Sponsors under the MyCC Scheme Client Guideline (MyCC\_CG) and Annex E - Certificate and Service Marks under the CCRA requirements.

### **MYCC Scheme Certification Mark**

- 3 A product, system or protection profile that has been certified under MyCC Scheme rules and meets its security claims and Common Criteria certification scope may carry the MyCC Scheme certification mark under those conditions defined in Common Criteria (CC) Certification Mark and as further described in MyCC Publications under the scheme website or in the MyCC Scheme Client Guideline (MyCC\_CG)
- 4 The MYCC Scheme service mark, as shown in Figure 1: MyCC Scheme Certification and Service Mark below, is to be used to identify, advertise, and market services which are performed by the MYCC Scheme certification body, or other parties in conjunction with the MYCC Scheme.

- 5 Sponsors may market that they have a product or system undergoing evaluation in the MyCC Scheme once it has been formally accepted by the MyCB provided that:
  - a) The marketing clearly identifies only the version of the product or system that is undergoing evaluation and no others.
- 6 Sponsors may not use any MyCC Scheme or CCRA logo until certification has been achieved.

## Common Criteria (CC) Certification Mark

- 7 Once MyCC Scheme is accepted into the CCRA as a certificate authorising participant, certificates issued by the MyCC Scheme will bear the Figure 2: The Common Criteria (CC) Certification Mark below.

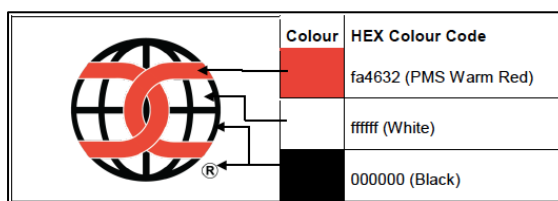
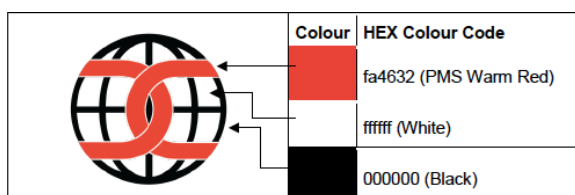


Figure 3: Common Criteria Certification Mark in colour with registered trademark symbol

- 8 A product whose certificate is recognised by MyCC Scheme and CCRA may carry the Common Criteria Certification Mark in Figure 3, (hereinafter referred to as the “CC Certification Mark”) in accordance with Annex E – Certificate and Service Marks<sup>1</sup>. This mark confirms that the Common Criteria certificate has been authorised by a CCRA Participant.

## Common Criteria (CC) Certificate Guideline

- 9 The CC Certification Mark as shown in Figure 2 shall be reproduced and shall be reprinted according to the following specifications;
- a) in colours coded as shown in Figure 3 and Figure 4; or

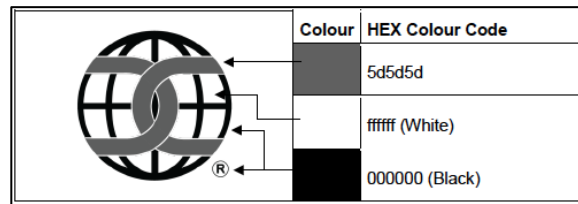


Figure 5: Common Criteria Certification Mark in black-and-white with registered symbol

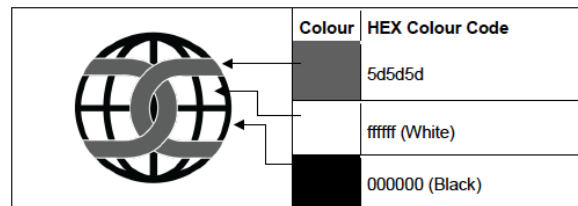


Figure 6: Common Criteria Certification Mark in black-and-white without registered symbol

  - b) in black and white as shown in Figure 5 and Figure 6; and
  - c) in any size, uniformly enlarged or reduced (and preserving all proportions).
- When used on paper, it may also be embossed or stamped.
- 10 Sponsors shall follow the specification as specified in Figure 2, Figure 3, Figure 5, or Figure 6 below.

Figure 4: Common Criteria Certification Mark in colour without registered trademark symbol

### Recognition Arrangement Service Mark

- 11 The service mark of this Recognition Arrangement, which is shown in Figure 8 below, is to be used to identify, advertise and market services which are performed by in conjunction with CCRA Annex E.2 – Certificate and Service Marks.

### Conditions of Use of the MyCC Scheme Service Mark and CC Certification Mark

- 12 Upon receipt of a Common Criteria certificate, the CC certification mark may be used by vendors in conjunction with advertising, marketing, and sales of the product for which the certificate is issued, based on the following requirements:
- use the issued certificate in documentation or marketing material by reproducing the entire certificate in an accurate and readable form;
  - conform to the requirements of this Arrangement and its Participants (or Compliant CBs) when referring to its certification status in communication media such as the internet, brochures or advertising, or other documents;
  - not make or permit any misleading statement regarding its certification;

- d) not use or permit the use of a certification document or any part thereof in a misleading manner;
  - e) upon withdrawal of its certification, discontinues its use of all advertising matter that contains a reference to certification, as directed by the Participants (or Compliant CBs) of this Arrangement;
  - f) not allow reference to its product certification to be used in such a way as to either express or imply that the Participants of this Arrangement, or other organisation that Recognises or gives effect to this certificate, endorse or give warranty to the certified product;
  - g) not imply that the certification applies to activities that are outside the scope of certification; and
  - h) not use its certification in such a manner that would bring the Arrangement into disrepute and lose public trust.
- 13 A certificate issued by MyCB may be used by sponsor or developer in documentation or marketing material for the certified product by reproducing the entire certificate in an accurate and readable form.
- 14 The product SHALL be the same product and version that is covered by the certificate.
- 15 Sponsors and Developers shall not use the marks in anyway other than those described in this section or explicitly authorised by the MyCC Scheme.
- 16 MyCB will monitor the use of the CC Certification Mark and the MyCC Scheme Service Mark. MyCB to take appropriate administrative, procedural or legal steps to prevent or counter the misuse of certificates and to correct false, misleading or improper statements about certificates or about the Evaluation and Certification Scheme.
- 17 If a sponsor or developer is found to be misusing either of the marks, MyCB will take one or more of the following actions:
- a) Notify the infringing party of the issue; and/or
  - b) Withdraw the certificate(s) that is associated with the infringement.
